As part of our commitment to the 94 Calls to Action of the Truth and Reconciliation Commission of Canada, the UN Declaration on the Rights of Indigenous Peoples, and the Caretakers' Calls to the Church, The United Church of Canada is seeking the wisdom of the Elders' Council and National Indigenous Council as to how we might respond. FOLLOW-UP: Regional Council Gathering (March 11 and 12)



For those who were not able to participate in our March regional council meeting, draft minutes are available at link below. The two-day meeting consisted of a series of five-minute presentations from leadership teams and networks, with two keynote presentations on faith and climate justice by Rev. Wendy Evans (videos available at link below), woven together with worship that involved movement of the body as well as the mind and spirit. Exciting news was shared about significant grants for a range of

initiatives. Several questions to the council, as well as proposed motions by the Living into Right Relations Leadership Circle, lifted up the need for improved communication, dialogue and collaboration between leadership teams, executive and ministry personnel. We were blessed by a conversation between Shanna Bernier and Alma Ransom exploring the deeper meaning of bold discipleship when translating the concept into Mohawk; and by the inspiring words shared by Ben Ryan about what it means to be a bold disciple. Our equity team reminded us of our progress, as well as the work that still needs to be done together in order to create space that is safe, welcoming and supportive of all members. Post-meeting survey results reviewed by the planning team highlighted the areas where participants felt joy and frustration, which will help us build on our strengths and improve on other areas as needed for future events.




A message from Shanna Bernier




