

I don't know about you, but I am ready to invite in all the joy that I can right now.

Enter Gurdeep Pandher. If you're not familiar with our June cover star, prepare to be delighted. The bhangra dancer is a Yukon internet sensation who has become world famous thanks to his joyful (and viral) videos, which feature Pandher performing bhangra — a traditional Punjabi folk dance — outdoors in the wilderness.

Pandher spoke to *Broadview* contributor Alex Mlynek for our June cover story, in a wide-ranging interview that covers how he first got into bhangra, his move to Canada and how his faith (Pandher is Sikh) helps him.

"Bhangra helps me send positivity and joy to the world, but it also helps me with my own mental health," Pandher says. "When I'm feeling down or when things are not going well, bhangra dancing provides me with a lot of happy therapy to recover, reset my mood and find my joy."

We will continue to build on the work Angelika has done and in the new context of the Diocesan College and UTC's recent merger, to ensure that French language leadership will continue to be served and build the church of the future.



Editor's Note: Retirement of Rev. Lee Ann Hogle

Angelika will be filling a vacancy created by the upcoming retirement of current minister of Ayer's Cliff, Magog and Georgeville, Rev. Lee Ann Hogle, who has faithfully served the pastoral charge since 2013. Congratulations and best wishes to Angelika and Lee Ann and the members of the pastoral charge as they all begin a new chapter!

Temporary Increase to Minimum Mileage Reimbursement Rate (shared by Rev. Dan Hayward) Considering the recent spike in gasoline prices and the prediction that they may remain at these levels for some time, the Executive of the General Council meeting April 30, 2022, temporarily increased the minimum mileage reimbursement rate to \$0.46/km. This is 75% of the CRA 2022 "reasonable allowance rate ... for the first 5,000 kilometers driven". This is effective May 1, 2022 to September 30, 2022. The General Secretary was authorized to extend this temporary increase to December 31, 2022 if fuel prices remain high. This applies to ministry personnel in pastoral relationships, volunteers, elected and appointment positions with the General Council, and staff of the General Council Office.

On April 15, I received an email confirming that the processing of a video interview I had given about Églsie Unie Pinguet in July 2021 to the Musée de la mémoire vivante of Saint-Jean-Port-Joli was completed and that it could be viewed at one of the museum's viewing stations. At the same time, I was told that they had agreed to attach the PDF version of the monograph that historian Jean-Louis Lalonde wrote in 2005, on the occasion of the hundredth anniversary of the inauguration of the church. As a former pastor at Pinguet, the news made me very happy. The history of Pinguet is the saga, over more than a century, of the resistance of a French-speaking Protestant minority swimming against the tide of a longstanding and hostile environment...


