For Indigenous History Month: That the Truth Will Not Be Forgotten (edited for length)

Over this past year First Nation, Inuit, and Métis leaders have again shouldered the burden of revealing the hard truths of our shared history. For decades, Indigenous survivors of residential institutions have kept alive the memories of their childhood friends and relatives, the children who went missing and never returned home...

I pray the truth told by First Nation, Inuit, and Métis peoples about their experience of cultural genocide in residential institutions will never be forgotten. I pray the nation and the church will never cease supporting Indigenous peoples in honouring the memories of their lost loved ones and in bringing the children home in keeping with the wishes of their families and communities. I pray the nation and the church will never again forget the many other ways in which Indigenous peoples have been and continue to be harmed by Canada's colonial legacy. And I pray all peoples will work with energy, passion, and commitment to overcome colonialization, racism, and injustice that continues to this very day...

REMINDER - Temporary Increase to Minimum Mileage Reimbursement Rate

Considering the recent spike in gasoline prices and the prediction that they may remain at these levels for some time, the Executive of the General Council meeting April 30, 2022, temporarily increased the minimum mileage reimbursement rate to \$0.46/km. This is 75% of the CRA 2022 "reasonable allowance rate ... for the first 5,000 kilometers driven". This is effective May 1, 2022 to September 30, 2022. The General Secretary was authorized to extend this temporary increase to December 31, 2022 if fuel prices remain high. *This applies to ministry personnel in pastoral relationships, volunteers, elected and appointment positions with the General Council, and staff of the General Council Office*.

PRESS RELEASE re Elections in Philippines



IOM Commissioner and Belgian Parliamentarian Séverine De Laveleye said, "These elections are extremely important to both the international community and the Filipino people, but sadly the

outcome suggests a continued drift towards repression, state impunity and state terror".

"These Philippine National Elections 2022 were not free and fair. They were marred by a higher level of failure of the electronic voting system than ever before, along with rampant vote-buying, disturbing levels of state and military orchestrated red-tagging of candidates and parties including numerous incidents of deadly violence," said Ms De Laveleye.


REMINDER - Musical Wednesdays (78 Rue Sainte-Ursule in Old Quebec)




