

DEEP SPIRITUALITY - BOLD DISCIPLESHIP - DARING JUSTICE

Longing and Belonging (by Judy Coffin, Communications staff)



As we move into a new year of living out our call to **deep spirituality, bold discipleship and daring justice** as a regional council, accounts of exhaustion and burnout from leaders and volunteers in communities of faith are widespread across the country (see link to Broadview article below, shared by St. Francis Cluster). While pandemic restrictions continue to amplify feelings of isolation, people seem to be longing for energy, for renewal, for meaning and a clear sense of purpose... and for connection with others who share the same longings.

A recent reflection from the Center for Action and Contemplation (see link below) focuses on God's wisdom and guidance about the importance of being part of something bigger, of bringing our gifts - and our needs - to our community.

...This is a neglected but important aspect of the prophetic call. In Numbers 11:24–29, Moses is exhausted with the people. Basically, God says "Okay, okay, assemble the elders. Look to the community. You were never supposed to do this alone. I told you to do it; I didn't tell you to do it alone." ...

Our belief as The United Church of Canada is that even the divine does not exist as an individual entity, but as a Holy Trinity, a small community plugged into a wider community in order to manifest deep spirituality, bold discipleship and daring justice. Our creed tells us, "We are not alone." So how can we build a stronger community as a regional council, supporting the prophetic gifts of our individual members and communities of faith?

One of the initiatives already planned for 2023 is to develop a **regional council directory** to allow people to connect more directly with each other and to ensure that regional council communications are reaching the relevant contacts in each community of faith. Another initiative will be a **communications survey** to gather feedback about what information is most important to you and how you would like to receive and share information with other members of the regional council.

As a regional council, we are here to serve communities of faith. What are your needs and how can we support them? How are your prophetic gifts calling us forward together? What can we simplify in order to focus on deep spirituality, bold discipleship and daring justice? We are eager to hear your thoughts!

REMINDER - Message from Quebec Public Health and la Table interreligieuse de concertation

A recent email from Public Health to la Table interreligieuse de concertation invites those responsible for places of worship to participate in awareness-raising efforts on the importance of wearing a mask in public places. This is not obligatory, but participation on our part can help to ensure that the number of people requiring hospital care remains reasonable, thus removing any possibility of restrictive health measures, as we have already experienced.

We'd like to advise you that the 2023 Annual Declaration for ministry personnel is **now open**, **until May 19**, **2023**. It's free and only takes a few minutes. Log in to churchhub.ca (Remember that Chrome or Edge are preferred browsers for ChurchHub; Safari is not optimal)

If you make your Annual Declaration (about whether you've had criminal charges in the last year or not) each year, you do not need to get a new police records check!

Festival of Biblical Telling (online) - Feb 3-5, 2023

Storytellers from across Canada, India, the USA and around the world gather to hone their bible telling skills and repertoire in a 2 1/2-day Festival of Biblical Telling. Workshops will cover a spectrum of topics: Biblical Telling 101, an introduction to performance criticism, biblical telling as a contemplative practice, sharing the Bible with children, starting small with little, tiny tellings, the ring shape found in biblical text, deaf signing our telling, coaching from the world of drama on how to prepare a text, the connection between paperless music leading and paperless biblical telling, Godly Play, and the role of story in Indigenous wisdom and community.
