IDENTITY AND PURPOSE: BEING WHO WE ARE (by Judy Coffin, Communications)

For those who haven't heard yet, my father passed away on January 30. As my family grieves, we also reflect on who my dad was as a person, and on how he followed the call to share his unique gifts and talents in the circles in which he moved. For me, my dad deeply embodied the following reflections posted by SALT Project a few weeks ago about being salt and light in the world:



Our identity and purpose — who we are and what we're meant to do — are virtually one and the same. Like salt and light, God made you as a small thing that can make a big difference for a larger whole. God made you to spice things up — not to overpower the dish, but to enliven it, enhancing and highlighting its other flavors. And likewise, God made you to shine, as only you can: a flame that can light up an entire room, or help guide a lost traveler home.

Jesus isn't giving his listeners a new role to play here; rather, he's naming who we already are. We don't have to work to become salt and light. God made us this way, blessing us with gifts that can bless the world. But we do have to claim and embrace and live out these gifts. We do have to actually be salty and luminous, fulfilling and embodying what our gifts make possible. We do have to be who we are.

As we continue to move forward together as a regional council, we are being called to understand and express **who we are** as individuals, as communities of faith, as a regional council. Other regional councils have their own identities and purpose; we are being called to express **who we are** as part of the body of Christ, as part of the larger church in the world, and in discerning how elements of the new strategic plan for The United Church of Canada as a whole might be expressed locally in meaningful ways, through deep spirituality, bold discipleship and daring justice. We will be talking about this more in coming days, but in the meantime, I invite you to reflect on this question: **Who do you say that we are?**

Three weeks, many emails and 1-1/2 practises later, a small group of nervous amateur musicians assembled at the front of the sanctuary and led their friends in a service of contemporary music taken from the Pop, Rock





SPECIAL APPEAL: Urgent appeal for Stem Cell Donors in Canada

(Virginia Wallace, Pastor Mount Bruno - Richelieu Valley United Churches)

Hello friends, my brother, Chris, is in urgent need of a stem cell transplant. He is suffering from a deadly form of leukemia called Myleofibrosis. My sister and I are currently being tested as donors for our brother, as siblings are usually the best possible match, but there are so many others suffering from various diseases that could be cured by stem cell donations. If you are between the ages of 17-35 (in Canada), I urge you to go to https://www.blood.ca/en or https://www.blood.ca/en or https://www.blood.ca/en or https://www.blood.ca/en or https://www.blood.ca/en or https://www.hema-quebec.qc.ca/index.en.html to request your cheek swab test kit. It's that simple. Once your cheek swab is analyzed and you are accepted, you may find out that your stem cells could save someone's life. If you are not in the age range (you probably know someone who is so spread the word), by signing the back of your driver's licence as an organ donor, or by giving blood regularly (my brother is currently receiving 2 pints of blood almost every week now) you may be saving someone's life.
