DEEP SPIRITUALITY - BOLD DISCIPLESHIP - DARING JUSTICE



From the Ashes, We Rise Again (by Judy Coffin, Communications staff)

One of the questions that came up in our recent video interview with Executive Minister Rev. Éric Hébert-Daly focused on the "inevitable" decline of church populations. You will be able to hear Éric's response to this and other questions as soon as the video is available, but in the meantime, I wonder if we could reflect together during this season of Lent, particularly on this Ash Wednesday, about hope in the face of struggle. (You may have noticed that I continue to rely on SALT Project for sources of inspiration, and a recent reflection on the transfiguration story, based on Matthew 17:1-9, did not disappoint):

In the context of the overall narrative, Matthew's central point in the Transfiguration story is this: the coming suffering and death of Jesus may at first appear as an unthinkable, desecrating defeat, but it's actually a step toward a dramatic, subversive victory. Jesus will now venture into the shadows of death — precisely in order to scatter those shadows once and for all, overcoming them in the end with shimmering light.

The reflection goes on to say:

[Jesus'] path of love will lead down into the valley, through the dry cinders of Ash Wednesday and the tears of the Via Dolorosa, the Way of Sorrow. But this week, from here where we stand on the mountaintop, we can survey the 40 days of Lent, take a deep breath — and remember that the journey through ashes and sorrow is never for its own sake. It's for the sake of what comes next. In a word, it's for the sake of transfiguration, a radiant new life and a dazzling new world.

How does our path of love lead us through the ashes of today to some sort of transfiguration and resurrection? One goal of The United Church of Canada as it heads towards its 100th anniversary is to create 100 new ministries. They may not look at all like what we know now. Without abandoning all of our existing ministries, can we find a way to nurture new expressions of ministry---of deep spirituality, bold discipleship and daring justice---and support them, walking forward together in hope?

Huntingdon United Church recently completed an environment-friendly update of their church building. They received a grant from Faithful Footprints in support of the upgrade of their electrical system; the installation of two heat pumps, two electric forced air furnaces, and an electric heater in the furnace room; the replacement of a gas furnace with an electric boiler, bathroom exhaust fan, outdoor light, stove, refrigerator, freezer, and all incandescent lights bulbs with LEDS; the insulation of the chimney, furnace room, and storage area; and the weather-stripping of front doors and back window. 



REMINDER - SPECIAL APPEAL: Urgent appeal for Stem Cell Donors in Canada

(Virginia Wallace, Pastor Mount Bruno - Richelieu Valley United Churches)

Hello friends, my brother, Chris, is in urgent need of a stem cell transplant. He is suffering from a deadly form of leukemia called Myleofibrosis. My sister and I are currently being tested as donors for our brother, as siblings are usually the best possible match, but there are so many others suffering from various diseases that could be cured by stem cell donations. If you are between the ages of 17-35 (in Canada), I urge you to go to https://www.blood.ca/en or https://www.blood.ca/en or https://www.hema-quebec.qc.ca/index.en.html to request your cheek swab test kit. It's that simple. Once your cheek swab is analyzed and you are accepted, you may find out that your stem cells could save someone's life. If you are not in the age range (you probably know someone who is so spread the word), by signing the back of your driver's licence as an organ donor, or by giving blood regularly (my brother is currently receiving 2 pints of blood almost every week now) you may be saving someone's life.
