DEEP SPIRITUALITY - BOLD DISCIPLESHIP - DARING JUSTICE

Child's Play (by Judy Coffin, Communications staff)

One of the inspirational starting points offered by my favourite resource, SALT Project, is a Theologian's Almanac, offering dates of significant milestones for use on social media, for writing sermons or enriching your devotional life. The following anecdote really got me thinking:

March 8 is the day in 1855 that a train first crossed the very first railway suspension bridge, an event that took place in Niagara Falls, New York — which raises the question: How exactly do you build a suspension bridge across an 800-foot gorge. 250 feet above the rushing water below?



The answer begins with a kite. An engineer named Charles Ellet Jr. announced a prize of \$5 for any child who managed to fly a kite across the gorge from the Canadian side to the American side, such that the kite string could be tied down on both sides. After a few days and many attempts, one enterprising boy managed the feat — and Ellet's team then tied a slightly heavier line to one end of the kite string and, by means of the kite string, pulled the heavier line across the gap. They then repeated the process with still heavier lines, then ropes, then light metal cables, then heavy metal cables — until there were lines across the gap strong enough to support a railway suspension bridge, and eventually to support an entire train.

This story reminds me how the impossible sometimes becomes possible when we allow our imagination and playfulness to be part of the process of finding solutions. How can we---as communities of faith, and as a regional council---incorporate this sense of wonder and play to be integrated into our thinking about deep spirituality, bold discipleship and daring justice as we move forward with a new strategic vision?

IN THE NEWS! Beulah United Church, Ayer's Cliff (Faithful Footprints)

Received a grant in support of the replacement of a hot water tank, oil tank, oil furnaces with electric furnaces, and electrical panel; the replacement of a window, industrial fridge, and rangehood in the kitchen, and four doors with panic bars; the installation of a dishwasher, and electric fans and LED lights in its sanctuary, vestry, kitchen, and office. A year following its projects, Beulah United reduced its GHG emission by **99.4%**, and energy costs by **26.0%**.


