What does it mean to be "Easter people"? (by Judy Coffin, Communications)



I think I was a teenager or young adult when I first heard the phrase describing Christians as "Easter people". Even after all these years, I remember being intrigued and curious to learn more about what it meant, a curiosity that continues to this day. Does it speak about hope in the face of despair? Does the phrase describe ordinary humans who don't give up despite harsh realities? Does it touch on the spark of the divine in each of God's children?

The image of the empty cross is a powerful one; it shows us that cruelty and injustice do not get the last word, and that new life can emerge unexpectedly from the most tragic circumstances. I believe it also means that when we walk in the garden carrying our deep grief about what we have lost, we may also meet loving "strangers" who astonish us and call us to new ways of being bold disciples, supporting daring justice and reflecting with deep spirituality as we travel our path as "Easter people" together.

United Church of Canada Statement on the Closure of Roxham Road



The United Church of Canada affirms that the right to seek asylum is a human right protected under international law.

On April 4, National Refugee Rights Day, Montreal City Mission, Canadian Council of Refugees and others held vigils across the country to protest the abrupt closing of Roxham Road, which has left refugees stranded; we mourn the loss of refugee rights.

In 2022, nearly 40,000 asylum seekers crossed into Canada using Roxham Road. They are not nameless. They are not faceless. They have names, hopes, dreams. They have loved ones they've left behind. They are fellow humans who seek safety because they are unsafe. They seek freedom because they are persecuted elsewhere.

The United Church of Canada urges the government to fulfill its legal obligations to uphold refugees' right to protection.

REGIONAL COUNCIL GATHERINGS



2023 WINTER MEETING - SUMMARY

The recent regional council meeting on March 24 and 25 (on Zoom) was an opportunity to explore how our regional council resonates with different aspects of a new strategic plan, with presentations by Executive Minister Rev. Éric Hébert-Daly, General Council representative Jennifer Henry and members of the VisionAction team: Rev. Cathy Hamilton, Royal Orr and Rev. Helen Hliaras.

In smaller groups, we discussed hope in terms of "confident expectation" and "bold truth-telling" and shared some of our hopes and concerns about various aspects of the plan as shown in the fish diagram in the photo at left, acknowledging

several of the ways in which the leading priority of the plan, Growth (Renew, Create, Invite) is already being lived out in our regional council.

On Saturday morning, a covenanting service with our new Executive Minister, Rev. Éric Hébert-Daly, was led by Pastoral Relations Minister Rev. Dan Hayward, Regional Council President Marc Grenon and former Executive Minister Rev. Rosemary Lambie. Joyful threads of music were deftly woven throughout the two-day meeting by Jessica Gauthier (with a guest appearance on Saturday morning by Michel Gauthier).

Alexya Gates Julien offered a compelling overview of the Faithful Footprints granting process for improving the environmental efficiency of church buildings and shared details of projects (completed and in process) of communities of faith within our regional council.

Several members of team responsible for exploring the Affirming Process for our Regional Council (Rita Beauséjour, Denis Ashby, Lisa Byer-de Wever and David-Roger Gagnon) shared an overview of the process and invited participation in planning conversations and gathering feedback across the regional council.

Reflection on Sabbatical Leave (by Rev. Read Sherman)

"I'm grateful for the opportunity afforded me by my charge and the Sabbatical Leave Committee to take a three-month sabbatical from my work during the fall and early winter of 2022 (plus an additional month of holiday time - making 4 months total). I took time to rest, be with family, travel to reconnect with friends and family in the USA. The highlight was a two-week pilgrimage to lona, Scotland. I had long known of the lona Community and its worship resources (especially hymnody), and the chance to go to lona Abbey in person and join with guests in twice-daily worship from around the world was a dream come true. John Bell was in residence the 2nd week, a very engaging leader in biblical reflection as well as hymn singing. I came away from those two weeks feeling challenged and renewed in my faith life. I also came away inspired by the island's beauty and the lona Community itself, deciding to become an Associate Member. Two weeks at lona has given me much to continue to reflect upon (a lifetime's worth, really!) and, God willing, transform into action as my ministry continues."



REMINDER - REMIT 1: Establishing an Autonomous National Indigenous Organization

The 44th General Council has authorized a remit on removing structural barriers so that the Indigenous Church can determine its place and structure within the United Church. The remit requires a vote by every regional council and each pastoral charge's governing body. Information about the remit, as well as voting cards, were sent to every regional council and each pastoral charge on March 10, either through email or Canada Post. Voting will take place **over the course of a year** between **March 15, 2023, and March 31, 2024**. Abstentions are considered a vote against the remit. **NOTE**: A regional council learning session about the remit may be offered prior to the regional council meeting in June 2023 for those who would like to learn more.


