DEEP SPIRITUALITY: REFLECTIONS TO SHARE





Reflections from the goldfish pond (by Judy Coffin, Communications) My stepdaughter is currently living in a big old house on a lovely property on the South Shore. The place is slated for eventual demolition and redevelopment, but in the meantime, Sarah and her family rent the huge space at a relatively economical price and make the most of all its features. She has a small but diverse flock of chickens near the back door that keep the family supplied with a beautiful variety of eggs in delicate shades of blue, beige and brown. Despite a busy career as a self-employed small business owner, she takes time to start seeds indoors with the kids to teach them the delights of growing things together in the garden. (Since the whole garden will eventually be bulldozed, she has also transplanted some of the perennial plants to our cottage garden.) In the springtime, she boils sap from the maple trees in a homemade boiler on the huge front verandah, sharing precious quantities of maple syrup to sweeten our pancakes. Behind the house is a giant cement pond that she has repaired, repainted and filled with water, aquatic plants and schools of goldfish. After several prototypes, she has constructed her own filter system to keep the water dynamic and fresh. She recently added a lovely arbour beside the pond, only to discover that the local kingfisher saw it as a convenient perch from which to devour the fish... so she devised a net to hang over the pond and protect them.

As with many of our communities of faith who are living fully despite impending uncertainties about the future, I am inspired by visions of living by the goldfish pond: inspired about hope, about adapting to challenges, about sharing gifts that nourish the wider community and about refusing to give in to the paralysis that can strike when we don't know what happens

next. Sarah's creativity and willingness to work towards short-term dreams despite an uncertain future are a gift to her family and her surroundings every day: nourishing bodies and spirits, creating beauty and keeping everything fresh and alive. Let's all be like Sarah!

Passed away peacefully on June 27, 2023 in his 89th year, in Kingston, Ontario, surrounded by family and friends. George is survived by Mary, his wife of 66 years, his three sons David, Brian and Roger, and his grandchildren. Born in 1934, George spent the first few years of his life in Windsor, Ontario. Then his family moved to Montreal where he received most of his schooling. He worked in the business world for several years, and then decided to go into the ministry, a career that lasted nearly 40 years. He was first appointed as a Student Minister in September 1960, where he served the Mansonville Pastoral Charge in the Quebec-Sherbrooke Presbytery of

the Montreal & Ottawa Conference. After two years, he moved to the Howick Pastoral Charge in Montreal Presbytery where he served for the next two years...

...His final creative effort was an illustrated reminiscence about his days as a modern Circuit Rider using a motorcycle instead of a horse to spread the Good News (see photo, circa 1975).


