DEEP SPIRITUALITY: REFLECTIONS TO SHARE

A Green Thumb and a Green Jersey (Judy Coffin, Communications)











My stepdaughter Ashley is an independent and resourceful single mom of twin boys. She has always had a green thumb, creating a beautiful growing space on her apartment balcony and cultivating a diverse collection of healthy houseplants. A few years ago, Ashley also managed to obtain membership in a local community garden, and has involved both of her sons in planting and maintaining a 10x30 foot space for growing fruit, vegetables and flowers. She discerns which tasks the boys enjoy most: one son loves to plant and harvest, while the other enjoys the trips back and forth to the water source. Each participates according to their gifts and interests and contributes to the resounding success of the garden, to the point where other gardeners often come to Ashley for inspiration or advice. The garden is also an intergenerational connecting point: in addition to sharing the actual fruits of her labour with us, Ashley also sends photos of her burgeoning blueberries to my mom, along with thoughtful messages about my late father's blueberry growing endeavours; and she and my mom compare notes on how this year's nasturtiums are coming along.

Cultivating a garden is one thing, but cultivating the potential of our children requires a whole other level of skill. Ashley recently signed both boys up for soccer. At the first practice, one of the boys was having an off day and told his mom there was no way he would wear the uniform. Ashley told him that he would still have

to go and get it from the coach like all the other players. Apparently, he reluctantly agreed and then kicked it all the way back across the field while Ashley watched with chagrin. Throughout the next week, at opportune moments, she persuaded him to try on various pieces of the uniform and equipment one at a time. By the time we came to visit them mid-week, he was proudly wearing the jersey, only changing for dinner in order to keep it clean.

When I think about the challenges facing our communities of faith, I often find parallels in my personal life or in my circle of family and friends. Like the soccer uniform, new things can be overwhelming and we are not always sure we want to try them on for size. Sometimes we need someone who cares about us deeply to persuade us to step out of our comfort zone, to help us find the right moment to test things out a little bit at a time so we can fully engage and enjoy the experience when the time comes. And just like our grandsons in the garden, if we can each learn to harness the gifts, talents and interests that are unique to us in order to contribute to the success of the whole, then we are really able to nourish ourselves and others from the bounty of the garden we share. Let's all be like Ashley (and the boys)!

As wildfires continue to rage across the country and we move into hurricane season, we are being called to act: by writing letters to government officials, participating in peaceful protests and sharing a message of faithful stewardship of the earth's resources. Action can also help to mitigate our feelings of grief and helplessness. Here are some ways you can get involved:

- For the Love of Creation: Join us for a moment of online prayer and reflection at 12 pm on September 1st to mark the World Day of Prayer for the Care of Creation, which marks the beginning of the Season of Creation, a period of ecumenical observance that runs from September 1 to the feast of St. Francis of Assisi on October 4.

The polluters must pay, in order for those disproportionately affected to get justice. Sign the faith letter for a fossil fuel non-proliferation treaty, and share it with as many people as you can.







