DEEP SPIRITUALITY - BOLD DISCIPLESHIP - DARING JUSTICE

Statement on Information Shared by the Stó:lō Nation

This information may be traumatic for residential institution survivors, families, and community. If you are feeling pain or distress, please call the free 24-hour crisis line: 1-866-925-4419. You can also call the First Nations and Inuit Hope for Wellness Help Line at 1-855-242-3310. It's toll-free and open 24 hours a day, 7 days a week.

The preliminary research findings about the initial number of deaths and the need for further ground research into both the known cemetery and unmarked graves at the Coqualeetza residential institution were outlined by the Stó:lō Nation in a qwōlqwel swáyel, a "day for telling news; talking together day."

The United Church of Canada was an active and willing participant in the operation of residential institutions. We were wrong to participate in this colonial, racist, and oppressive system. Once again, we are confronted with the consequences of our actions.

"As with previous announcements from caretaker communities, the church will not look away from the truth that continues to be uncovered," The Rt Rev Dr. Carmen Lansdowne, Moderator of The United Church of Canada, said. "The United Church of Canada continues our commitment to live into our Apologies, to be accountable, and to further the work of truth and reconciliation in concrete acts of justice and reparation."

With deep remorse and grief, The United Church of Canada acknowledges the truth that has been revealed at the Coqualeetza institution, which was run by the United Church from 1925 to 1940.

We invite tangible actions from the people of the United Church to be in solidarity with 2SLGBTQIA+ peoples, in response to these proposed policy changes.

Côte Saint-Luc to induct Na'kuset onto its Human Rights Walkway

The City of Côte Saint-Luc will unveil of a plaque on its Human Rights Walkway on Wednesday, September 27, 2023, at 10:30am in honour of Na'kuset, Executive Director of Native Women's Shelter of Montreal. Na'kuset launched many programs including the Miyoskamin second stage housing project, Saralikitaaq (a social pediatric centre open to Indigenous children and their families across Montreal), the Iskweu Project (immediate assistance to missing Indigenous women or girls), the Cabot Square Project (counselling, referrals, and liaison with other social services), and Resilience

Montreal (food and shelter, mental health and medical support services).

Inaugurated in September 2000 and located at Pierre Elliott Trudeau Park, the Côte Saint-Luc Human Rights Walkway is dedicated to those men and women who, by their steadfast commitment to humankind, have held high the torch of human rights and let it light the world.

"Human rights are critically important to our city council and our residents," Mayor Mitchell Brownstein said. "The Côte Saint-Luc Human Rights Walkway is where we honour those who advocate for human rights here and around the world. We're proud to add the name Na'kuset to the walkway and hope it will serve as an inspiration to all those who visit the park."




