REGIONAL COUNCIL NEWS

Visit from Partner Council of The United Church of Canada (shared by Rev. Dr. Samuel V. Dansokho)







On Tuesday, October 24, Plymouth-Trinity was delighted to welcome a delegation from our Partner Council, accompanied by Rev. Éric Hébert-Daly, Executive Minister of Conseil régional Nakonha:ka Regional Council.

The delegation had visited Ayer's Cliff earlier, and spent the rest of the afternoon with Plymouth-Trinity. Approximately twenty people accepted the invitation. After a word of welcome from Board Chairman Jack Eby, Rev. Dr. Samuel V. Dansokho followed with a prayer and the presentation of a "peace candle" to all three guests. Éric then recalled the significance of their presence before giving them the floor.

Annie Namala spoke of the great difficulties faced not only by Christians, but by many other ethnic and religious minorities. Her work in defense of human rights keeps her busy and takes up a lot of her time, far from the church where she is a committed laywoman.

Samer Latham is the representative of the Middle East Council of Churches. He travels back and forth to Montreal. The situation is very difficult, not only for Palestinian Muslims, but also for the Christian minority. The council aims to be ecumenical and inter-religious in its approach and activities.

After the visitors, it was the turn of the Rodriguez-Flores family, Jack Eby and Shanna Bernier to speak about the local faith community and the youth program throughout the regional council. The Rodriguez-Flores family's story elicited many emotions and questions from our guests.

The meeting ended with a prayer from Annie and a delicious Malagasy meal served by Saveurs et Délices, a restaurant-caterer run by siblings from the FJKM sister church.

REMINDER - The governing board of each pastoral charge has a right and responsibility to vote on this remit, and all votes must be submitted by **March 31, 2024**. If a pastoral charge does not submit a vote, the default will be to count the missing vote as a vote against the remit.

REMINDER - CEBA Loan Repayment

In anticipation of the repayment of federal Canada Emergency Business Account 'CEBA' loan, the United Church has developed a repayment program for UCC congregations who find themselves struggling to fully repay their commercial CEBA loans - which would trigger foregoing the already accounted for forgiveness portion. We have created a loan program to support our congregations through this transition. To take advantage you must respond prior to December 10, 2023. To provide bridging support, the national office is prepared to facilitate a swap out of the commercial loan and replace it with a UCC loan. In short, UCC would issue loans of \$30,000 or \$40,000 for the express purpose of paying off CEBA. All eligible United Church CEBA loan holders in good standing with UCC are able to take advantage of this loan at an interest rate of 5.0%. First payment comes due February 1st, 2024. To get started simply complete the loan agreement and forward to Maria Pimpinella at mpimpinella@united-church.ca along with a copy of void cheque.

PROPERTY AND FINANCE LEADERSHIP TEAM

REMINDER - New Resources for Treasurers

Nakonha:ka Regional Council has taken three initiatives to assist treasurers of our communities of faith in performing their duties.

Firstly, we have evaluated and are recommending the use of two easy-to-use and inexpensive non-profit accounting software products from the company Software4Nonprofits. Their bookkeeping software is called "Accounts" and has the following capabilities:

- bookkeeping (journal entries, sample or custom chart of accounts)
- banking (deposits, cheques, reconciliation)
- tracking income, expenses, assets, liabilities, funds
- generating financial statements (income statement, balance sheet)
- generating annual charity information returns (federal and provincial)

The annual cost of this software is \$129 plus tax. We have arranged for a \$50 discount on the first-year purchase price (i.e., you will pay \$79 for the first year) - please contact Brian Ruse prior to purchasing for information on obtaining the discount.

The second software product is called "Donation" and allows you to track donors and to create automated charitable tax receipts. A plus is that donations can be imported directly from PAR. The annual cost of this software is \$99 plus tax. We have also arranged for a \$50 discount on the first-year purchase price of this software (i.e., you will pay \$49 for the first year) - please contact Brian Ruse prior to purchasing for information on obtaining the discount.

Secondly, we have arranged with the Quebec Council of Christian Charities/Conseil Québécois des Organismes Chrétiens to assist the treasurers of our communities of faith. You will be able to take advantage, at no cost to you, of their bookkeeping and accounting services (in both French and English), including:

- · calculating payroll deductions
- preparing tax slips (T4, T4A, Relevé 1, etc.)
- · applying for GST & QST rebates
- preparing annual charity information returns (T3010, TP985.22-V)

Thirdly, the Property and Finance Leadership Team, thanks in large part to the efforts of member Craig McAlpine, has developed an auto-generating scheduling calendar/spreadsheet for treasurers, which creates a customized to-do list for treasurer tasks throughout the year.

We will be providing more information on these initiatives in the coming weeks. In the meantime, please contact Brian Ruse at *bruse@united-church.ca* with any questions.


