BOLD DISCIPLESHIP – GET OUT THE VOTE (REMIT 1)

Over the past months, a tireless team of volunteers has been reaching out to pastoral charges, encouraging them to vote on *Remit 1: Creating an Autonomous Indigenous Organization* and to submit those votes to General Council to be counted. This remit is an important step towards reconciliation with indigenous ministries, respecting their wish to travel forward together in two separate but equal canoes.

The deadline is approaching quickly, and we know you've had a lot of questions about the impact if the remit is passed. A new video (see link below) answers more questions; and don't forget to check out the FAQs and the main remit page for more information.

To date, only 42.8% of Nakonha:ka pastoral charges have voted. The deadline to vote is March 31, 2024.

SUMMARY - Regional Council Executive – January 2024

The meeting (on January 18, 2024) received recommendations from the Pastoral Relations Team (appointments and a call); received recommendations from the Property & Finance leadership Team (a policy on delegation of all property and finance matters to its Finance & Extension Board (F&E), and a proposed agreement of amalgamation between Summerlea United Church and SouthWest United Church); received recommendations from the Regional Council's Strategic Plan Development Team (terms of reference for the Nakonha:ka Regional Council Strategic Fund); considered a research proposal submitted by Callosum; received reporting on voting within the Regional Council on Remit 1: Establishing an Autonomous National Indigenous Organization; considered the creation of a database of all cemeteries within the Bounds of the Regional Council; discussed GS 63 Recommendations on The Use of The Word "Mission" Origin: General Secretary; discussed the possibility of a Regional Council privacy policy in relation to Quebec Law 25; and received reports from La Table, the Minister Supporting Clusters & Networks, the Living Into Right Relations Leadership Circle, Communications, the General Meeting Planning Leadership Team, and the First Thirds Ministry Leadership Team. A motion was passed to express gratitude to the members of the former Property and Finance Leadership Team, (now absorbed into the Finance & Extension Board) for their dedication and service.

Next Executive meeting will be February 15, 2024. Executive members and staff are requested to submit any correspondence, reports or other documents one week in advance.
