Let's embrace the journey, rising like a phoenix from the ashes of the past, as we answer God's call by modeling love and building beloved community.

DARING JUSTICE – Pink Shirt Day (February 28, 2024)

In 2007, in Berwick, Nova Scotia, after a new student at their school was bullied for wearing a pink shirt, two grade 12 students bought 50 pink shirts and encouraged their classmates to wear pink. The next day, to their surprise, the majority of students arrived wearing pink! With that act of kindness, Pink Shirt Day was born. The movement has continued to grow, and now the **last Wednesday each February is Canada's national Pink Shirt/anti-bullying day.**

BOLD DISCIPLESHIP – GET OUT THE VOTE (REMIT 1)

Over the past months, a tireless team of volunteers has been reaching out to pastoral charges, encouraging them to vote on *Remit 1: Creating an Autonomous Indigenous Organization* and to submit those votes to General Council to be counted. This remit is an important step towards reconciliation with indigenous ministries, respecting their wish to travel forward together in two separate but equal canoes.

To date, only 50.6% of Nakonha:ka pastoral charges have voted. The deadline to vote is March 31, 2024.

BOLD DISCIPLESHIP - Cuba: A Country of Contradictions

CCS Diaconal Ministry student Lisa Byer-de Wever recently returned from her Global Perspectives Experience trip to Cuba with Montreal Dio. These are her initial reflections, as shared with the Centre for Christian Studies (CCS).



GPE (Global Perspective Experience), Study Tour, or Mission? These simple words have different meanings and are impactful and potentially harmful if not engaged in a faithful and intentional way. When I returned home, the first questions were: "How was your vacation?", "How was your experience?", "How was your Mission?" I was at a loss to respond, so I answered with "exhausting, exhilarating, heartbreaking and hopeful". These were the first words that my head and heart could use to start to process the deep and impactful experience of my time in Cuba.

Canadian mining companies are destroying communities in the Philippines but this United Church mission team is determined to help. Twelve years ago, the Beaconsfield Initiative team started working with activists and human rights organizations to protect the Cordillera region...Twelve years since his team stepped foot on what was sometimes rocky and unpaved Philippine soil, Rev. give it a try. It's in a beta format right now, and the participants would love your feedback as they make it better. While it is targeted to youth, it is suitable for those over 26 too!



Project Insights and Energy Results

(Faithful Footprints)

Received a grant to update its electrical entrance from 200 amps to 400 amps; replace oil furnace with two 24 000 BTU heat pumps in the lower level and an electric boiler; install two 20 KW electric forced air furnaces, one on each level to supplement the heat pumps and drain the hot water system; install an electric heater in the furnace room; insulate its chimney with fiberglass insulation; caulk the front windows on the lower level; repair and install weather stripping on its front doors; insulate and seal

back window; upgrade bathroom exhaust fan; replace incandescent light bulbs with LEDs, including its backyard light; insulate furnace room and storage area under from entrance with spray foam insulation; replace kitchen stove, refrigerator and freezer with more efficient models. A year following their projects, Huntingdon United reduced its source EUI by 26.6%, total GHG emissions by 99.4%, direct GHG Emissions intensity by 100.0%, energy costs by 46.7%, and energy cost intensity by 46.6%.

Give it up for the Earth! - February 14 - March 28 (Citizens for Public Justice)

Citizens for Public Justice's Give it up for the Earth! is a national faith-in-action campaign that raises awareness about the climate crisis and mobilizes people across Canada to reduce personal and household greenhouse gas emissions, engage in acts of solidarity, and collect signatures as a demonstration of support for increased federal climate action. Give it up for the Earth! 2024 includes three action items:

- A pledge to reduce your personal and household greenhouse gas emissions.
- A Commitment to embrace eco-spirituality through climate action and by building relationships with the Indigenous communities on whose traditional territories we live, work, and play.
- Sending a letter to the Minister of the Environment and Climate Change, Steven Guilbeault, urging him to set more ambitious climate action targets and expressing support for a just transition towards a low-carbon economy.
