BOLD DISCIPLESHIP – GET OUT THE VOTE (REMIT 1)

Over the past months, a tireless team of volunteers has been reaching out to pastoral charges, encouraging them to vote on *Remit 1: Creating an Autonomous Indigenous Organization* and to submit those votes to General Council to be counted. This remit is an important step towards reconciliation with indigenous ministries, respecting their wish to travel forward together in two separate but equal canoes.

To date, only 57% of Nakonha:ka pastoral charges have voted. The deadline to vote is March 31, 2024.

PLYMOUTH-TRINITY UNITED CHURCH (SHERBROOKE)

IN THE NEWS: Commemoration of Mosque Attack (shared by Vivienne Galanis; excerpt of article by Daniel Kirchin in Sherbrooke Record)

In a solemn remembrance ceremony held at Plymouth Trinity United Church on Monday evening [January 29^{th}], community members gathered to reflect on a harrowing incident that occurred seven years ago. The event, etched

vividly in the memory of those present, unfolded on a Sunday evening when a shooter entered the Islamic Cultural Centre of Quebec, leaving six people dead and five injured.

The annual commemoration activity, organized by Actions interculturelles executive director Mohamed Soulami and Abdelilah Hamdache, president of the Institute of the Arab and Muslim World of Estrie, saw the participation of 12 organizations, including the Federation of Cultural Communities of Estrie, the Transcultural Educational Association, the Diocese of Sherbrooke, and the Islamic Cemetery of South-Eastern Quebec.

Others including Samuel Dansokho, Ahmed Chraibi, Aurélie Caldwell, and Gérard Coté, collaborated in the commemoration ceremony. As a diverse assembly gathered for a symbolic minute of silence and contemplation, candles were lit by young people from the Muslim community, symbolizing a collective remembrance and a call for unity.

Summary of February 15, 2024, Executive meeting: This meeting received recommendations from the Pastoral Relations Leadership Team, in particular, a request to administer the sacraments; received recommendations from the Finance & Extension Board (F&E), in particular, to amend general by-laws of F&E, to name members to the board, to ratify the appointment of the vice-president, to grant permission to list for sale the property of Granby United Church, and to receive the F&E executive summary for 2023; received an update in regards to the Strategic Plan, in particular, the implementation plan, the ministry leadership retreat, the worship showcase, the building and strengthening relationships with communities of faith activity stream, and the growth advisory team (order of the day 10:40 AM); considered a proposal for Saints-Martyrs-Canadiens Cemetery; received an updated list of pastoral charges which have not yet voted on Remit 1: Establishing an Autonomous National Indigenous Organization; received reporting from La Table; received reporting from Communications, in particular, the regional council's response to Projet de loi 25, and focus groups; received an update from the General Meeting Planning Leadership Team, in particular, planning, and future dates (2025) of general meetings, and the Eastern Ontario Outaouais Regional Council, educational event: Strengthening Invitation; received recommendations from the Nominations Leadership Team, in particular, a proposed model of the executive, and received updates in regards to the vacancy of President-Elect, and the General Council's nominations committee setting up a task group to review the current three-court governance structure; received notice that Eastern Ontario Outaouais Regional Council plans to extinguish lease agreement with Nakonha:ka Regional Council and Summerlea United Church; and received a human resources report (in camera).

SAD NEWS: Rev. Alison Louise Etter (May 22, 1982, to February 14, 2024)



Alison had been a member of the United Church's Theology and Inter-Church Inter-Faith Committee (TICIF) since 2015 and became chair in 2021. She brought many gifts to the work of TICIF, as a member and as a chairperson.

Alison was instrumental in writing the report on theologies of adoption and with the chairperson at the time, the Rev. Dan Hayward, wrote the United Church's apology for forced and coerced adoptions from church-run maternity facilities.

She was a thoughtful, intelligent person, with a ready laugh and a generous heart. She was a gifted chairperson, able to hear and hold many different perspectives within the committee, in ways that respected each person's contributions. Her laughter, grace, and thoughtfulness are solely missed.

In sure and certain hope of resurrection, we give thanks for Alison and mourn her death.

In these times of populist rhetoric and hate speech both south and north of the border, it was more than uplifting to listen to Premier Kinew's vision of a province and a country that leaves no one behind.

Particularly moving was his description of a Sundance ceremony in the US last summer where he witnessed the repatriation of the remains of a young Lakota child that had died in a boarding school some 140 years ago. Her

family throughout multiple generations had never given up hope of reuniting with her, holding her memory and passing it down from generation to generation.
