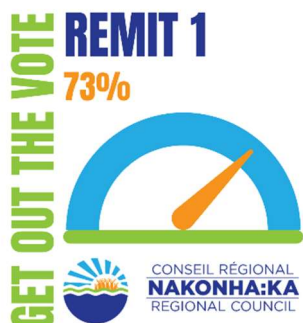
REMINDER - Moderator's Message for National Affirming Day/PIE Day – **TOMORROW, March 14, 2024**

BOLD DISCIPLESHIP – GET OUT THE VOTE (REMIT 1)

Over the past months, a tireless team of volunteers has been reaching out to pastoral charges, encouraging them to vote on *Remit 1: Creating an Autonomous Indigenous Organization* and to submit those votes to General Council to be counted. This remit is an important step towards reconciliation with indigenous ministries, respecting their wish to travel forward together in two separate but equal canoes.

To date, 73% of Nakonha:ka pastoral charges have voted. The deadline to vote is **March 31, 2024.**

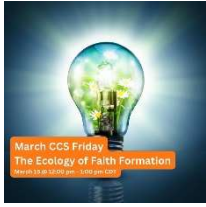

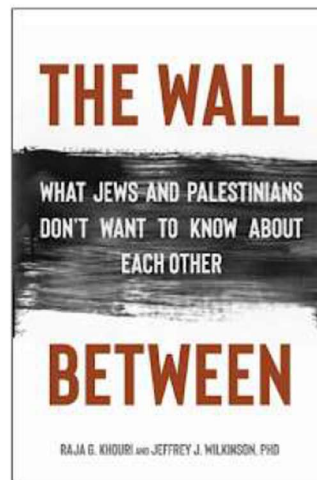

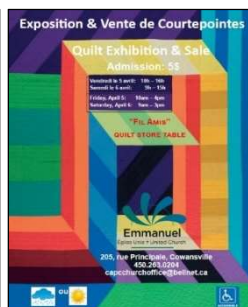

Key Highlights from General Council Executive

The United Church of Canada's General Council Executive (GCE) met on February 23-24, focusing on generative and strategic discussions. They emphasized equity and decolonization in governance, discussed challenges faced by local communities, and received reports on various initiatives. *Read about all of the key highlights (including the information below about GC45) on <https://generalcouncil44.ca/>*

Gearing up for 45th General Council (GC45) in Calgary, August 2025

Rev. Taylor Croissant, chair of the GC45 planning committee, presented a general outline of timelines and format for the 45th General Council at the Telus Centre in Calgary, AB, in August of 2025.

The theme will be *Visions and Dreams*, based on Acts 2:17: "I will pour out my Spirit upon all flesh, and your sons and your daughters shall prophesy, your young shall see visions, and your elders shall dream dreams." The installation of the new Moderator will be at Knox United Church in Calgary on the last day of the General Council.

Prior to August in-person gathering, there will be two June listening and discussion sessions held online (currently proposed for June 14 and June 22, 2025). Listening and discussion for the most challenging of proposals will happen in person during GC45. A new proposals template and guide is being developed. Rev. Croissant noted that the new template encourages proposals that are not too prescriptive, enabling the General Council a greater breadth of possibilities in addressing the presenting issue.
